**Last week we have been ...**

- talking about our weekend news to a small group and illustrating it
- Learning the sounds i, n, m, d and learning jolly phonics actions and songs
- learning the tricky words 'l', 'no', 'go'
- playing phonics games and exploring phonics resources
- continuing to practise writing our names with increasing independence
- reading our school reading books in class, describing the story, title, what is happening and how the story might end
- reading the story of the 'Three Little Pigs'
- sequencing the story
- trying to write the initial sounds in words from the three little pigs story
- talking about what makes us special in RE
- learning about Harvest and getting ready for a Harvest Festival
- drawing vegetables and fruit
- singing songs and tapping sticks faster and slower along with the songs
- talking about similarities and differences between ourselves and our friends
- going on a number hunt around the school
- focussing on the number 3
- counting to 20 and back and undertaking a daily maths challenge
- practising matching numerals with objects counted
- going on 2d shape hunts around the school and noticing shapes in our environment
- making shape pictures and talking about 2d shapes- circles, rectangles, squares and triangles
- building houses for the three little pigs
- ordering objects by size
- getting ready for PE
- taking part in some three little pigs yoga
- playing 'What's the time Mr Wolf?'
- thinking about how to use our learning powers in the classroom to help us grow new stars in our brains
- going to a whole school virtual 'celebration assembly' to celebrate our achievements with the rest of the school

Please could you go through your child's phonics and tricky words and read with them every day. Each week we highlight the sounds and tricky words we have been learning in class. Keep recording your reading minutes in your yellow reading record books for our class 'reading miles' challenge.
