Other Information.

Please read with your child every night and have a look at the phonics and tricky words we have learned this week.

This Weeks Homework is to practise getting clothes, shoes and coats on and off. The children are working towards becoming increasingly independent with their dressing and undressing at school. This includes putting on and doing up shoes, taking a jumper off and putting the sleeves around the correct way and doing up poppers, buttons and zips on coats.

By encouraging and helping your child to do their homework you will be helping them to practice and extend the skills and knowledge learnt in school, whilst encouraging them to be an independent learner.
